- host weekly operations meetings to facilitate coordination and cooperation among local, regional and state entities engaged in the Pine Creek Community recovery to GET WORK DONE




# Your LTRO at Work!

#### In 2022 so far, we've

- Developed the "welcome basket" program, delivering practical goods to 24 new homeowners
- Elected LTRO treasurer, John Lenz as our representative to the Malden Town Council
- Welcomed Lori Dickinson to LTRO meetings as the liaison from the Town Council
- Collaborated with the Red Cross, WAM, and Innovia to fund six new more volunteer-built homes We also received a Rails to Trails grant to update the Malden Palouse to Cascades Trailhead
- Partnered with New Stories in Spokane to provide trauma informed and community gatherings

#### **Plants for Bees!**



Help restore the bee population to the Pine Creek area by planting plants with pollen and nectar that also can withstand the drought. In the examples provided below remember to choose plants that will provide blooms all year long.

#### **Bloom Cycle**

| Golden Current                          | April - June     |
|---|------------------|
| Cone Flower (Echinacea)July – September |                  |
| Bee Balm                                | July - September |
| Rudbeckia                               | June - September |
| Salvia                                  | May - September  |
| Sedum                                   | July – September |
| Catmint                                 | May - September  |
| Asters                                  | August -October  |
| Golden Rod                              | August - October |
| Lavender                                | June – September |
| Sunflower                               | July – September |

## Fire Wise Landscaping



Spring is here and the start to cleaning up yard debris. Cleaning up pine needles and scattered wood limbs from trees, removing dead branches and cutting back shrubs are all steps that can be taken to prepare for a defensible area around your home when it comes to fire. As you are planning your landscape projects make sure when choosing mulches that you are using a fire wise option as bark mulch vs. wood mulch react very differently in a fire... do your research.

You should have a defensible space that extends 30 feet from structures, flammable materials include firewood, fencing, debris under decks, and debris on roofs and under eves of homes.

When planting Shrubs and trees make sure to space plants that are nearest to your home in widely spaced patterns and not large masses this will help create a more defendable space. Use Native species when possible as they are less likely to create fuel.
